Logistics

In addition to in-camp services, meals and lodgings, Skyline Hikers provides bus transport from check-in point to trailhead and back, and transports your duffle bag into and out of camp.


Mission

Canadian Rockies Hiking Experience Since 1933



Enjoy a Unique Rockies Alpine Hiking & Camping Experience



Each hiker participates daily in one of 5+ hikes offered that is suited to their particular abilities. Hikes range from easy jaunts to a nearby waterfall, to a strenuous climb to a mountain lookout. Distances range from 5 to 25 kilometres with up to 1500 metre elevation gain.

Wilderness accommodation is provided for up to 54 hikers in each camp. Prospector-style tents accommodate up to four hikers each. The tents are outfitted with a woodburning stove and thick foam sleeping pads. Biffies with toilet seats and wash-up tent (with hot water) provided.

Skilled cooks provide hearty, balanced hot breakfast and dinner daily, and bag lunches for the trail. Some special dietary needs can be accommodated.

In-camp medical assistance is provided. Protocol includes emergency medical evacuation procedure.
